

William Hamilton to Lars Schall:

*Deaths attributed to the INSLAW case*

Lars:

(1) The vice chairman of the Cabazon Indian Tribe in Indio, California and two friends who were murdered, execution-style, in the vice chairman's home in June 1981 as the vice chairman was planning to meet with an investigative reporter to expose wrongdoing in connection with the Joint Venture between the Wackenhut Corporation and the Cabazon Indians. FBI and Department of Justice elements allegedly obstructed efforts to solve the triple homicide. The Joint Venture was allegedly modifying PROMIS on behalf of U.S. intelligence, including the CIA and the NSA.

(2) Alan Standorf, a civilian employee of NSA at its Vint Hill, Virginia intercept facility, was found beaten to death in the backseat of his car in the parking lot at Reagan National Airport in late January 1991. He was allegedly the person who provided Danny Casolaro copies of computer printouts from the {PROMIS-derivative} Main Core domestic spying database system then administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) at its Culpepper, Virginia computer center, allegedly for hand-off to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) and the U.S. Army in the event of a national catastrophe and the imposition of martial law. The Washington Post reported in the early 1990s that the government was never able to solve the murder and that NSA assumed it was a street robbery that went bad. {As someone who worked at NSA, I consider it ludicrous for the government to claim it was never able to resolve the murder of one of its employees}.

(3) Danny Casolaro, a free-lance investigative reporter, was found dead in his hotel room in Martinsburgh, West Virginia on August 10, 1991, eight months following the death of Alan Standorf, allegedly in the course of a covert intelligence operation intended to recover every copy of the computer printouts from the Main Core domestic spying database system that Casolaro had acquired through the assistance of Alan Standorf. Casolaro told me that Joseph Cuellar, a U.S. Army Special Forces Intelligence Major, had arranged the meeting so Casolaro could interview Peter Videnieks in Martinsburgh during the weekend of August 9, 1991. Casolaro told me that Cuellar had shown up in the neighborhood pub near Casolaro's home, approximately one month before Casolaro's death, and introduced himself, telling Casolaro, inter alia, that Peter Videnieks was one of his closest friends. Casolaro later told me that Cuellar had succeeded in getting Videnieks to agree to be interviewed for an entire weekend.

There are many other deaths attributed to the INSLAW case about which I am, at the best, agnostic. The deaths listed in this email are credibly connected to the INSLAW Affair.
